The Warren County Board of Commissioners, City of Camak, City of Norwood, and City of Warrenton met for a Joint Called Meeting on Tuesday, August 26, 2025, at 6:30 p.m. This meeting was held in the Warren County Community Service Building located at 48 Warren Street.

John R. Graham, Chairman of the Warren County Board of Commissioners, stated that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss FLOST, including the possibility of adding a 1% Sales Tax option to the November 4, 2025, ballot. Chairman Graham provided a draft of the Intergovernmental Agreement, along with an associated chart. He also offered a complete overview of HB 581 and FLOST. Chairman Graham clarified that the process involves Warren County first entering into the Intergovernmental Agreement with the participating municipalities, followed by a vote scheduled for November 4, 2025. If approved, sales taxes would be collected throughout the entire year from January 2026 to December 2026, and the rollback would be reflected in the year 2027.

Chair Graham previously requested information from all the cities, including their millage rates and the total amount of LOST collected for the year 2024, which was provided. Using this information, Chair Graham was able to create a chart that visually represents the distribution percentages allocated to the county and each city.

Chairman Graham informed the group that the funds should be deposited into a separate account, which may accrue interest. He further clarified that, if we proceed with this agreement, a mutually agreed-upon date for the County to transfer the funds to the cities must be established. All municipalities agreed on July 1st of each year as the designated date.


Chair Graham stated that the Board of Commissioners could hold a Public Hearing a few weeks prior to the November 4th election, if necessary. He also expressed his willingness to attend any upcoming city council meeting to address any questions or discussions related to the topics covered today.

The City of Warrenton, the City of Camak, the City of Norwood, and the Warren County Board of Commissioners decided to move forward collaboratively with the Intergovernmental Agreement. They have agreed upon the percentages and the date for transferring funds, which is set for July 1st.


Chairman Graham expressed appreciation to everyone for their attendance and asked whether there were any questions or concerns. He promptly addressed all questions raised.
